The town welcomed her with polite curiosity but didn't pry; everyone sensed she had secrets buried deeper than the church's old foundations.

One afternoon, after a community meeting, Ellen lingered by the door, staring out at the wild garden.

"Beautiful in its own way, isn't it?" said Grace, a fellow congregant, appearing beside her. Ellen's eyes remained on the garden. "It doesn't hide its past," she replied softly.



Your impact: Providing safety in exile for Syrian and Palestinian refugees living in Jordan

Rima*, a mother of six, has been living in Jordan for 20 years after fleeing Gaza in 2004. Three of her children are disabled, and Rima struggled with isolation and the burden of raising her family. But everything changed when she joined the Forsa project.

Act for Peace's local partner in Jordan, the Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees (DSPR), runs the Forsa project - a two-year

initiative that works with members of the Syrian and Palestinian refugee community, to assist them in reaching a point of self-reliance.

It is a transformational program that not only helps refugees to meet their basic needs, like food and healthcare, but focuses on long-term solutions through relevant training, and then eventually onto employment or small enterprises. This helps families just like Rima's to have a reliable and long-term source of income and hope for the future.

Rima has now started her own sewing business from home, which enables her to earn a stable source of income. while still being able to care for her children.

She is also more confident thanks to the support she has received and feels a greater sense of community and belonging for her family.


