The Little One Who Could

In a dusty village on the outskirts of a bustling city, there lived a young boy named Tariq. His family was poor, barely able to scrape together enough money for food, and their small, crumbling home was tucked away at the edge of the town, far from where the influential and wealthy people lived. Tariq himself was small for his age, with dark eyes that seemed too large for his face and skin the colour of the earth after rain.




His clothes were hand-me-downs, frayed and patched, and he often felt like he was invisible in a world that only noticed the rich and powerful.

Tariq's family had arrived in the village years ago from a far-off land where the language was different, the customs unfamiliar, and the people were often treated with suspicion. His mother and father worked tirelessly as street vendors, selling simple fruits and vegetables, but it was a struggle. The other children at school made fun of Tariq, calling him names that hinted at his family's foreign origins, and when he played with the other kids, they usually ignored him or told him to go away.

One day, as the village prepared for its annual festival, an important event that brought together the richest and most influential people from the region, the elders of the village announced that they were looking for someone special to represent the community in a grand procession. This procession was an honour, an opportunity for the chosen person to show the world what the village stood for. It was always a child of prominence, someone with a family of stature or wealth, someone who could be a shining example of the village's success.

Your impact: Supporting Sri Lankan families to return home after years of being displaced.



Jesu built a temporary hut to protect his family after returning home to Sri Lanka. He now proudly stands by the permanent house he built with the support of OfERR

In 2006, as violence escalated in Sri Lanka, Jesu was forced to flee his homeland with his wife and four children. They sought refuge in India, where they lived in a refugee camp for thirteen years. To support his family and ensure his children's education, Jesu took on demanding construction jobs. Unfortunately, the physical strain of his work led to a debilitating stroke, requiring extensive medical treatment.

In 2019, with the situation in Sri Lanka stabilising, Jesu and his family returned to their homeland, only to find that their home had been completely destroyed during the war. Undeterred, Jesu built a small, thatched hut on his land to shelter his family.

The Organisation for Elangai Refugees Rehabilitation (OfERR), which has worked alongside Act for Peace for over 35 years, played a crucial role in helping his family transition back to life in Sri Lanka. When OfERR volunteers learned of Jesu's situation, they quickly provided him with a temporary shelter, offering the safety and security his family desperately needed.

Through persistent advocacy by OfERR and Jesu himself, he was able to secure a permanent house under the government's housing scheme. Today, he has successfully built this house and found work as a fisherman in his village.

With over 70,000 refugees still living in camps across Tamil Nadu, organisations like OfERR continue to be beacons of hope, easing the transition back home and striving to restore lives disrupted by decades of conflict.

Thank you to all those who volunteered at the Bookshop over the last few weeks. The shop is now closed for a well deserved break and will reopen in February 2025.




